Activities:											
We have been looking at the work of famous artist L.S. Lowry. Create two different urban landscapes in your homework books of areas surrounding you. You can choose to include elements of everyday life in your work, such as people and vehicles. Try to add shading and colour to your urban landscapes to add a mood to your artwork.	Last term, we began to explore what fossils are and how they are formed. Try to create your own fossil at home. To create a fossil at home, you can bury an object in sand or salt dough, then fill the impression with plaster or flour. Take photos of the fossilisation process, and bring in your discovery to share with your class.	Visit a local library to research books linked to volcanoes, rocks and earthquakes. Practise looking for information using the contents and index pages. Using the information you find, create a short non-chronological report on your chosen topic. Remember to include sub-headings for each section.	Task 1: Use a magnet to test which household items are magnetic, and which are not.
