Topic for the Term—Through the Ages

In the Through the Ages project, the children will learn about three different periods of British prehistory: the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age. They will discover terminology relating to time and sequence dates to make a timeline. They explore the changes to people, homes and lifestyle throughout the different periods and investigate examples of prehistoric settlements, monuments, burials and artefacts in detail. They will also study how

technology improved over time, including how the discovery of different metals changed the way that people lived.

Educational Visits / Theme Days

We will have a themed workshop based around the Stone Age era. Children will be transported back, 1000's and 1000's of years and will gain an insight into what life was like in pre-historic times! We also have an Immersive Day linked to the Topic work.



Science

This term, our science topic is 'Skeletal and Muscular Systems'. This project teaches children about the importance of nutrition for humans and other animals. They learn about the role of a skeleton and muscles and identify animals with different types of skeleton.

- ♦ Learn the weekly spellings, helping your child to learn the tricky words.
