<p style="text-align: center;">Transient Art</p> <p>Transient art is moveable, non-permanent and usually made of a variety of objects and materials.</p> <p>Use a range of natural materials such as grass, pebbles, sand, leaves, pine cones, seeds and flowers to make a piece of transient artwork. This could be created in an outdoor space, such as the garden or park.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Wonderful Weather</p> <p>Record the weather every day for a week.</p> <p>Create a grid with space for the days of the week, a picture and at least one sentence about each day's observations.</p> <div style="text-align: center;"> </div>	<p style="text-align: center;">Comparison Champions</p> <p>Compare number sentences using the symbols < greater than, > less than, and = equal to.</p> <p>Include five addition and five subtraction number sentences. Try to use each of the symbols at least once.</p> <p>For example, $4 + 2 < 3 + 6$ $7 + 1 = 9 - 1$ $9 - 4 > 5 - 2$</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Brilliant Buildings</p> <p>Create a landmark or city using junk modelling resources.
