



Uniform Policy

March 2026

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We have used the DfE non-statutory guidance on school uniform and agree with the guidance given by the DfE which states:

'The school uniform plays a valuable role in contributing to the ethos of a school and setting an appropriate tone. The Department strongly encourages schools to have a uniform as it can instil pride; support positive behaviour and discipline; encourage identity with, and support for, schools ethos; ensure pupils of all races and backgrounds feel welcome; protect children from social pressures to dress in a particular way; and nurture cohesion and promote good relations between different groups of pupils. The Department also encourages schools to have a very clear position about appearance such as hair colour, style and length and the wearing of jewellery and make-up.'

We provide a complete list of the items needed for school uniform in our school prospectus. The wearing of correct school uniform, is therefore strongly encouraged.

We have now restricted the number of branded items based on the latest government guidance: *From September 2026, UK government guidance (via the Children's Wellbeing and Schools Bill) dictates schools in England must limit compulsory branded uniform items to a maximum of three.*

Aims and Objectives

The School Uniform and Dress Code:

- will establish a sense of identity with, and support for, the school ethos
- can engender equality and a sense of community and belonging towards the school
- supports positive behaviour and discipline
- is practical and smart
- is regarded as suitable wear for school and is considered by parents as good value for money
- is designed with health and safety in mind.

Guidelines

Jewellery

For safety reasons, jewellery of any kind, including earrings or studs must not be worn in school. Earrings/studs can be dangerous especially during PE lessons and playtime. Medical identification bracelets may be worn by children who have significant medical problems e.g.: diabetes or epilepsy. A plain, non-digital, analogue watch can be worn.

Hairstyles

The school does not permit children to have haircuts that could serve as a distraction to other children. Hairstyles and haircuts which are deemed too extreme such as tramlines, stars, shaved heads (no shorter than a number 2), patterns, 'V' styles, Mohican cuts, or dyed, tipped, dipped hair or any embellishments to the hair are also unacceptable. All hair should be smartly worn and pupils with long hair should also tie it back for safety reasons. Hair should be tied using plain hair bands

(purple, blue, red, yellow) and/or clips of the same colour. No beads or baubles should be braided into the hair.

Nails and Make up

Please keep children's finger nails clipped short. Finger nails should not be painted with nail varnish. No makeup is to be worn to school.

Footwear

The school wants all children to grow into healthy adults. We believe that it is dangerous for children to wear shoes that have platform soles or high heels. Neither do we allow children to wear trainers to school; this footwear is appropriate for sport or for leisurewear, but is not in keeping with the smart appearance of a school uniform. All children should wear black, closed-toed shoes as stated in the uniform list.

The Role of Parents

We ask all parents who send their children to our school to support the school uniform policy and send their children to school correctly dressed and ready for their daily schoolwork. One of the responsibilities of parents is to ensure that their child has the correct uniform, it is clean and tidy and clearly labelled with their child's name.

Role of Governors

It is the governors' responsibility to ensure that the school uniform meets all the regulations concerning equal opportunities. The governors will consider, with the Headteacher, any requests from parents for individual children to have special dispensation, either for religious or medical reasons, with regard to school uniform.

Availability of Uniform

Branded items of uniform will now be available at Pages Schoolwear shop. Other stores are specified for particular items.

Pages Schoolwear offers a variety of ways to order and collect uniform. It can be ordered via its online system on its website with free delivery to school. Collection can be made from the school office. There is the option to order by telephone or in person at the shop in Maidstone Town Centre. Home delivery is also available.
